
What is the Representative Body?

- ▶ A group of 12 Learning Disability England members who are elected by our membership to steer Learning Disability England.
- ▶ They represent our members and act on their behalf, making important decisions about what Learning Disability England says and does.



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


- ▶ Our Representative Body members make sure that Learning Disability England stays true to its values and is always working towards its goals.
- ▶ Any member can put themselves forward to be on the Representative Body, and all members can vote.



There are...

- ▶ 4 People with Learning Disabilities Representatives
- ▶ 4 Families & Friends Representatives
- ▶ 4 Organisations & Professionals Representatives



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What does being a Representative Body member involve?

We think being a member of the Representative Body will be about 11 hours of work every 3 months:

- A 4-hour meeting every 3 months
- 4 hours to read papers and get ready for the meetings
- 1 hour a month of emails or phone calls outside of meetings.

The role is unpaid but we will pay for you to get to meetings



To be a member of the Representative Body you must...



- ▶ Be a member of Learning Disability England.
- ▶ Agree to work together with self-advocates, families, friends and allies, organisations and LDE staff.
- ▶ Be able to attend 4 meetings a year and come to the meetings prepared.
- ▶ Be able to travel to meetings, with support if necessary.
- ▶ Be able to stay on the Representative Body for 3 years.

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Something to think about...



You must be able to represent the views of all the members not just your own views so...

- ▶ How might you go about finding out other peoples views?
- ▶ In what way would you communicate with the other members?
- ▶ Do you have links with other members already?
- ▶ What would you do if other peoples views were different to your own?

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You must also share Learning Disability England's values:



- ▶ **People with learning disabilities first**—in everything we do and how we are run.
- ▶ **Be challenging**—when it comes to what people with learning disabilities and families want, need and have a right to.
- ▶ **Work together**—to achieve better lives for people with learning disabilities.
- ▶ **Be empowering**—by making sure our members have power and can act on behalf of LDE with confidence and clarity.
- ▶ **Be creative and try new things**—by thinking differently about how we can solve problems and not being afraid to get it wrong sometimes.

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How to become a member of the Representative Body...



- ▶ We will be holding elections this Spring - people will have to vote for you.
- ▶ You will have to write a very short manifesto - a bit of writing that tells people who you are and why you think they should vote for you.
- ▶ You will also be asked to record a short video, but we can help you with this.
- ▶ All LDE members can stand in the election.

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We all need help and support....



- ▶ Please don't worry about needing help and support either with your application or to be a member of the Rep Body.
- ▶ Our Rep Body works as a team. We all support each other.
- ▶ And we will make sure you get help and support with your application, including making your video clip, if you need it.

Just Ask!



Key Dates...



- ▶ Closing date for applications is 5pm on 30th March
- ▶ Shortlisted applicants notified by 24th April
- ▶ Shortlisted applicants make their video clip and submit it by 5pm on 22nd May
- ▶ Election period for all Members to vote 1st – 21st June
- ▶ Election results published on 1st July
- ▶ New Representative Body Members start their induction from mid-July onwards
