Keynotes

Minority Voices: Amplifying the voices of people with profound and complex disabilities in policy making Rachel Wright Founder/Director Born at the Right Time

People with complex neurodisability make up 0.1% of population and use over 5% of the total health budget in Paediatrics. They require a trisector response from health, social care and SEND.



**Rachel Wright** 

Rachel Wright is a qualified nurse, Founder/Director of Born at the Right Time and Executive Board member for ComplexUs. She's the author of The Skies I'm Under, host of the popular The Skies We're Under Podcast, Peer Leader, Personalised Care Ambassador and parent of a young man with complex neurodisabilities.

Born at the Right Time puts the lived experience of families at the heart of its work and is passionate about improving lives through parent/carer support, CPD-certified training for practitioners and influencing policy makers and providers. ComplexUs is made up of specialists in their professional fields and experts by experience as primary caregivers. It is a collective voice working in partnership with practitioners, commissioners, and policy makers to pioneer credible solutions to a system which is not currently fit for purpose for those with complex neurodisabilities and their families.



**People with learning disabilities and their family from minority ethnic communities** Keynote

Ramandeep Kaur

Key focus points: I will be focusing on the lack of diversity amongst campaigners, civil servants, policy makers and DPO's and how this impacts the outcomes of people with learning disabilities from minoritized ethnic groups.

Some of the examples I will use are from recent campaigns which excluded the voices of people like me and my son and refused to engage with us.

I will also focus on evidence given at the recent Covid 19 Inquiry which has shown that the lack of diversity resulted in poor decision making which impacted minoritized ethnic groups.

As someone who has completed a Masters in Social Policy, I am aware that policy makers rely on evidence generated by the third sector and universities, but there are still gaps in knowledge about the needs of minoritized ethnic groups and I want to talk about possible solutions for inclusion of people with learning disabilities and their families not only in campaigning and lobbying but in research projects.

I will talk a little about the findings from my own research project (dissertation and pilot project with Changing Our Lives – once permission is sought from them).

As a campaigner and parent activist, I work to promote the dignities and human rights of people with learning disabilities and my interest is in health inequalities and minoritized ethnic communities. I have a Masters in Social Policy and am a public speaker, a freelance researcher and I use my lived experience to work with national charities in training programmes and research projects.
