“All Our Voices” is making sure people with learning disabilities are included in talking about climate change.

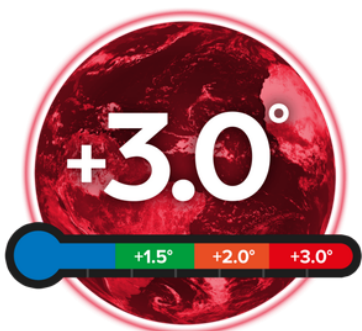


We want to know what people know about climate change, and what they are doing about climate change

What climate change is



Climate change means the Earth's temperature and weather patterns are changing over time.



The planet is getting warmer on average.



This is happening partly because of what humans do, like burning coal, oil and gas which gives off gases that trap heat in the atmosphere.



Climate change can lead to things like hotter temperatures, more extreme weather, rising sea levels, and changes to nature and wildlife.



Some people do not believe this is happening.
Climate change has also been called 'global warming' and 'climate emergency'.

What our project is about



Inspired Purpose, Future Directions CIC and Learning Disability England are working together to find out:



- What people with learning disabilities know about climate change.



- If anything has happened to them because of climate change.



- What people with learning disabilities and their groups are doing about climate change.'

What we will do



Stage 1 (April –September 2026)



- We will talk to people and hold workshops and events as part of our work



- We will ask people and groups to look at some questions and tell us what they think



- We will write a report about what people told us



Stage 2 (September 2026 – September 2027)



- Keep looking at the first stage findings



- Work with university partner (IMPACT) to reach more people



- Write a report on how social care can reduce climate change

Why we are doing this



- People with learning disabilities can be more affected by climate change, but their voices aren't always heard.



- Their experiences can help improve what society does about climate change.



- It is important that everyone gets the chance to tell us what they think so we get better ideas about what can be done.
