Over supporting/inappropriate support for when not needed. For example when people are supported to Meadowhall but either don't like it or can go on their own.



Support agencies that don't work weekends.



Little alternatives to personal budgets/direct payments. For example Individual Service Funds.



Loneliness on a weekend. No community alternatives being funded.



Still some involvement that doesn't seem real.



Slow/no response to crisis. Which could/does lead to devastating consequences and quicker decline.
